### Manatee County Animal Ordinance Reminder

Residents, renters, and/or guests of Trailer Estates with a dog please review the following:

According to ordinance 22-16, no dog shall be "at large," upon any public property, street, or sidewalk, or on private property of another, without the consent of the property owner. Additionally, the owner or custodian of a dog must have "direct control" of such animal at all times.

The following definitions are related to this section of the ordinance to assist with understanding specific meanings:

**AT LARGE** shall mean any dog on the owner's premises, not in the control of the owner or custodian; or any dog off the premises of the owner or custodian and not under the physical control of the owner or custodian.

**DIRECT CONTROL** shall mean immediate and continuous control of an animal at all times by means such as a fence, animal carrier or cage, leash, tether, cord, or chain of sufficient strength to restrain the animal or the animal shall be within the unobstructed sight, attended, and supervised by a competent person, by use of hand or voice control, when on the property of the owner or custodian, or property which the owner or custodian of the animal has the right to use.

### **Recycle Information**

Please put all other items in the solid waste dumpster. Never place items above the rim of the dumpster nor on the ground around the dumpster. Solid waste dumpster is for general trash and debris. **NO FLAM-ABLES, OILS, BATTERIES, CHEMICALS OR PROPANE TANKS AL-LOWED**. These items can be recycled quarterly at Manatee County recycle locations at no charge. ### **TE Shredding Event – March 1st**

Do you have documents that need to be shredded, but you don't own a shredder? You're in luck! On Saturday, March 1 from 9AM–11AM you can have them securely shredded, at no charge, during the Trailer Estates Shredding Event. The Proshred truck will be parked in the circular driveway off Bay Drive by 9AM. We suggest you come early because Proshred's capacity is limited, so the event may end early. Bring your documents and your TE issued ID to take part in this event. NOTE: Their equipment cannot handle damp or wet paper—all items to be shred MUST BE DRY.

**What they CAN shred:** All paper, file folders, hanging files, computer paper, note pads, and envelopes. Staples, paper clips, and rubber bands do not need to be removed.

**What they CAN NOT shred:** damp or wet paper, 3 ring binders, hard-bound books, CDs, DVDs, data tapes, hard drives, microfilm, and x-rays.

### **Marina News**

The marina is very limited on longer size slips. If you are going to buy a boat that is over 19 feet long, **please**, call the dock master to see if we have a slip available. The Dock master has had to disappoint several people by telling them we had no place for them to dock their new boat.

Boats will only be rented slips that they fit in. For instance, if you have a boat that fits in a 28 foot slip, you will not be able to rent a 30 ft slip, if your boat fits in a 22ft slip, you will not able to rent a 26ftslip. The larger slips are for longer boats. Boats are measured from the farthest thing that sticks out on the bow to the motor in full tilt. We do not measure your boat by what it says on the registration.

If you are buying a party boat, deck boat or pontoon boat, please watch the size of the beam (width) of the boat you buy. These newer, wider boats have a hard time fitting in many of the slips without touching the sides of the decking. Please buy a boat that will give you room, on each side, to adjust with the ebb and flow of the tide.

# Are You Leasing a TE Boat Slip or Storage Lot?

### If So, This Friendly Reminder Is For You...

- Whenever you get a new boat (vessel) registration, we need a copy of it at the office.
- Whenever you get a new registration for the trailer in your storage lot, we also need a copy of that.
- Finally, whenever you renew your insurance for the items above, we need a copy of that renewal, as well.

### **Table Reservation Etiquette**

If you need banquet tables, card tables, or folding chairs you must reserve them. You can do this by visiting the office or calling to make your request. We allow no more than 3 banquet tables, 6 card tables, and/or 30 chairs per household, per event. We suggest reserving them one week prior to the date you need them because availability is limited and reservations are on a first-come basis. NOTE: The tables and chairs under the stage in the large hall are off limits.

### From Old to New: Fob to FOB-ID

If you're in the Park and have not visited the office for your new FOB-ID, please do so during regular office hours. Please bring your old Fob and your valid TE ID (green for owners and yellow for renters) to be turned in to receive your new FOB-ID. If you don't have a valid TE ID, please bring your driver's license. If you're not in the Park, your old Fob won't work and the office is closed on the weekends, so plan your return accordingly.

**REMINDER**: If you are an owner with a renter at your property, the renter(s) CAN NOT use your FOB-ID, they must register at the office, and if not already purchased, purchase their own FOB-ID.

**NOTE**: Do not leave your FOB-ID exposed to the summer heat, it could warp the plastic and render it inoperable. If your FOB-ID gets damaged (or lost) a replacement costs \$50.

# **Estoppel Program for Trailer Estates PP-27C**

Estoppel Program Cost to Process: \$100 per Estoppel (Payable to Trailer Estates)

Any person who Sells/Purchases/Makes a Title Transfer of Property within Trailer Estates Park & Recreation District must submit an Estoppel Request to the main office. This is done by the Title Company or attorney who is handling the closing. Private sales or Transfer of Title (Quit Claim) must still submit the estoppel request even if not using a title company or Attorney.

In addition, a written application from each prospective purchaser must be submitted and approved BEFORE the sale or transfer. 12. In order to maintain a community of congenial residents who are agreeable to abide by the "housing for older persons" restrictions contained in the Deed Restrictions and provisions of the Charter of Trailer Estates Park and Recreation District (hereinafter collectively "Restrictions"), the transfer of lots or parcels by any owner shall be subject to the conditions hereinafter set forth as long as said Restrictions shall remain in force and effect: It shall be necessary for the Board of Trustees of the Trailer Estates Park and Recreation District, or its duly authorized officers, agents or committee, to approve in writing all sales, transfer of title, leases or subleases of a lot or parcel, or occupation of a dwelling unit on a lot or parcel, before such sale, transfer, lease, sublease or occupation shall be valid and effective. Written application for such approval shall contain such information as may be reasonably required by application forms promulgated by the board of Trustees and shall be accompanied by a transfer fee as required by resolution of the Board, provided; however, such fee shall not exceed Fifty (\$50.00) Dollars.

Trailer Estates will perform the following actions:

- Advise any Fines or Service Fees charged to Property by Trailer Estates.
- 2. Advise any outstanding Violations.
- 3. Require appropriate Application(s) to be filled out and completed, along with Application Fee to Live/Own/Rent Property in Trailer Estates prior to closing.
- 4. Age Verification & ID check (copy of Driver's License or State ID, Birth Certificate, ETC.
- 5. We will Disclose the Annual Assessment Cost + Any Special Assessment(s) that are in place.
- 6. Advise that Trailer Estates is not a Pet Friendly Community (except 46 Specific Homes).

If the Estoppel process is not followed by anyone who Sells/Purchases/Makes a Title Transfer of Property within Trailer Estates Park & Recreation District, they may be subject to Fines & Suspensions under Part E of the Rules & Regulations.

# Receiving Mail & Parcels at Trailer Estates

Attention New Residents (and long-timers, too):

To ensure you receive mail, please use your TE Post Office Box Number (or another PO Box outside of TE). If you give your TE physical address as a mailing address, you will not receive your mail. Use your physical address for the delivery of parcels and/or large items like furniture and appliances. Additionally, please check that the address listed with the Manatee County Property Appraiser is an address other than your TE physical address. # The Importance of Accident and Incident Reporting

The Policy and Procedure #27B-Accident and Incident Reporting policy was adopted in 2022, and copies are available next to the first aid boxes. To quote from the policy, "If an accident or incident occurs on District property, it is critical to gather information and document the event for reporting purposes. An accident or incident is defined as any event that leads to a personal injury to a resident, guest, or visitor." This policy depends on everyone to do the right thing by reporting any accident or incident, whether you are a witness or directly involved in the event. EMS is to be called for every accident or incident occurring on District property.

Now you are probably thinking, "What do I do if I witness someone who has been injured?" We ask everyone to complete the Accident and Incident Reporting form and gather as much information as possible. Even if you did not witness the accident/incident, but come upon an individual who has been involved in an accident or appears injured, the information you provide on the form is vital. Completing this document does not hold you responsible. Once the Accident and Incident Reporting form is completed, please drop it by the office, or in the night drop box, if the office is closed. This information is shared with the District's liability carrier.

What makes Trailer Estates unique as a 55+ community is its long history of caring for each other. We ask that every resident familiarize yourself with this Policy and Procedure and act on it if you become involved in or witness an accident or incident.

### **Public Notice Warning**

According to Florida Law, consumers who knowingly hire unlicensed construction contractors could face a fine of up to \$5,000. Chapter 455-228 of the Florida Statutes allows the Florida Department of Business and Professional Regulation (DBPR) to impose a civil penalty of \$500 to \$5,000 on individuals who aid and abet unlicensed contractors. They may also be liable for court costs.



### **Architectural Review Committee**

ARC APPROVAL for HURRICANE RELATED REPAIRS & REPLACEMENT

You DO need to complete and submit the ARC form PP33, but you DO NOT need to wait for approval to do the work.

If you make any changes to the outside of your home that ARE NOT related to hurricane damage, you must first obtain an ARC approval. This approval is needed for repairs and/or new work such as doors, windows, stairs, paver, A/C, sheds, fencing, etc. Prior to beginning any work, you need to complete and submit a Deed Restrictions Building Request (PP33). You can get this form at the TE office or on the TE website. The ARC will review your completed request and notify you of the approval/denial. Please note that for some work, a lot survey MAY BE REQUIRED.

Upon approval, an orange card will be issued and must be displayed in your window for six months or until the project is completed, whichever comes first. All permits will expire six months from the date of issue. The ARC has up to thirty days to act on your request.

If you are submitting a PP33 for any fence installation on your property, you MUST provide a site/lot survey. These surveys let you (and your neighbor) know exactly where the lot lines are located and are there for your protection when you install your fence.

#### **POLITICAL SIGNS, BANNERS, AND FLAGS**

RULES AND REGULATIONS, PART F: SPECIAL RULES GOVERNING SIGNAGE; SECTION II POLITICAL SIGNAGE, states the rules regarding political signage. This can be viewed at the <u>TRAILERESTATES.COM</u> website under the subtitle GOVERNANCE: RULES AND REGULATIONS.

If you have not taken down your political sign, banner, or flag, you could receive a violation.

#### STORM RELATED REPAIRS

You still need to apply for an ARC permit to make repairs. Work can start on repairs before an ARC permit is received, but you still need to get a permit. Additionally, make sure the contractor you are using is licensed and has the necessary permits.



And since John loved a good parade, he spent 25 years coordinating the Marion Popcorn Festival Parade, 2 hours long with 300 entries, held yearly in September, and before that, the Y-Men's July 4th parade. He also served as a Commissioner for the Drum and Bugle Corp of Marion!

While John was busy in Church and his community, his family was growing. (Say "hi" to Cyn White on California St, John's daughter.) John first experienced Florida as a teenager, traveling by train to meet an uncle and aunt in Venice and help drive them back north. Later, his widowed mother was to join the uncle in Venice with John driving her down in fall and picking her up in the spring.

He was one of the original CERT members and served on

the park's Future Planning Committee. John is a lifetime Woodshop member and avid supporter of Bob Long's Christmas toys, bringing wood from Marion for toys. If you have ever needed medical equipment, it is the Park's Square Club (Masonic) Members who have donated time and money for the upkeep and delivery of equipment – and no one has put more time in than John. 

### **Cozy Recipes**

#### **NO-KNEAD DINNER ROLLS**

#### Ingredients

- 4 cups (512 g) unbleached all-purpose flour
- 2 teaspoons (10 g) kosher salt
- 2 teaspoons (8 g) sugar
- 2 teaspoons (8 g) instant yeast or active dry yeast
- 1 to 2 tablespoons minced fresh thyme leaves or other herbs (a mix of rosemary, sage, and thyme is nice)
- 2 cups (454 g) lukewarm water
- room temperature butter, about 2 tablespoons, plus more for brushing, if you wish

#### Instructions

If you are using instant yeast: In a large mixing bowl, whisk together the flour, salt, sugar, instant yeast, and fresh thyme leaves. Add the water. Mix until the flour is absorbed. Cover with plastic wrap or a tea towel or cloth bowl cover. Place in a warm spot to rise for 1.5 to 2 hours.

If you are using active dry yeast: In a small mixing bowl, dissolve the sugar into the water. Sprinkle the yeast over top. There is no need to stir it up. Let it stand for about 10 to 15 minutes or until the mixture is foamy and/or bubbling just a bit — this step will ensure that the yeast is active. Meanwhile, in a large bowl, whisk together the flour, salt, and thyme. When the yeast-water-sugar mixture is foamy, stir it up, and add it to the flour bowl. Mix until the flour is absorbed. Cover with plastic wrap or a tea towel or cloth bowl cover. (At this point, you can cover the bowl and place it in the fridge for 1 to 3 days.)

Place in a warm spot to rise for 1.5 to 2 hours. Meanwhile, generously butter a 12-cup muffin pan.

Preheat the oven to 425°F. Punch down your dough and pull it from the sides and to the center. Divide the dough into 12 portions. This won't be pretty, but it doesn't matter. Let the dough rise for about 17 to 20 minutes or until it has risen to just above the top of the muffin cups.

Bake for 15 minutes. Reduce the heat to 375° and bake for 10 to 15 minutes longer. Remove from the oven and turn the rolls onto a cooling rack or directly into a bread basket.

#### **COUSCOUS CHICKEN SOUP**

#### **Ingredients**

- 1 cup chopped onions about 1/2 of a medium
- 3/4 cup sliced leeks about 1 medium, white and light green parts only
- 1/2 cup sliced carrots about 1 medium
- 1/2 cup chopped celery about 2 ribs
- 1 tablespoon minced ginger
- 1 tablespoon minced lemongrass or paste
- 2 cloves minced garlic
- 1/2 teaspoon ground turmeric
- 4 cups chicken stock
- 1/2 teaspoon bouillon chicken seasoning (optional)
- 8 ounces cooked, shredded chicken (rotisserie chicken is great)
- 1 cup pearl couscous
- 1/2 of a lemon
- salt and pepper
- chopped fresh parsley for garnish



Heat one tablespoon of the stock in a 4 to 5 quart Dutch oven or stock pot over medium. When it begins to sizzle, add the onions, leeks, carrots, and celery. Saute until the vegetables are soft, about 6 minutes. Stir in the ginger, lemongrass, and garlic, and heat until aromatic. Sprinkle the turmeric over the vegetables and stir.

Add the stock, chicken, and couscous, and bring to a light boil. Reduce heat to maintain a gentle simmer; cook for 15 minutes. Squeeze the half lemon into the soup, taste, and season with salt and pepper to your liking. Top with parsley before serving.

#### **BROWN BUTTER CHOCOLATE CHIP COOKIES**

Preheat the oven to 350°F.

#### Ingredients

1 stick (1/2 cup) unsalted butter

¼ cup granulated sugar

2/3 cup packed light brown sugar

2 tablespoons neutral oil or olive oil

1 ¼ cups (175g) all-purpose flour (unsifted)

½ teaspoon baking soda

½ teaspoon kosher salt

<sup>1</sup>/<sub>s</sub> teaspoon cinnamon

1 egg, plus 1 egg yolk

1 teaspoon vanilla extract

4 oz best quality chocolate (dark or milk), chopped (plus extra for topping, recommended)

Flaky sea salt, for finishing

#### Instructions

Brown the butter: Place the butter (sliced into pieces) in a skillet over medium heat. Heat for a few minutes until it melts, turns foamy, and then starts to become golden brown and then brown in color and smells nutty. For the best flavor, you'll want the butter to be very brown: but not burnt! Be careful because it can burn very quickly.

Immediately remove from the heat and transfer to a medium mixing bowl. Stir in the sugars and oil into the butter. Allow to cool until it is room temperature, for about 10 minutes (we like to place the bowl in the refrigerator for this part). Meanwhile, in a medium bowl, combine the flour, baking soda, cinnamon, and kosher salt. Set aside

After the sugar mixture is room temperature, use a spatula to stir in the egg, egg yolk, and vanilla until smooth. Then stir in the flour mixture until smooth. Stir in the chopped chocolate, saving out about 1/6 of the chunks for the topping (or you can add it all and use additional for topping).

Scoop out 1/3 cup scoops into 12 medium (50 g) sized cookies. Place them across two baking sheets. Refrigerate the dough for 30 minutes. (It is very important to form the dough into cookies before refrigerating, and to refrigerate at least 30 minutes (or up to 1 hour), otherwise the cookies will spread in the oven. You want the dough as cold as possible.

Bake the cookies until golden brown and set at the edges, about 12 to 14 minutes for the 12 medium cookies on sheets. Keep in mind, the bake time depends on your specific oven, so adjust as necessary. You'll want them just golden and baked through, but still slightly underbaked so they stay chewy.

Remove from the oven and press in extra chopped chocolate into the tops of the cookies then sprinkle with a small pinch of flaky sea salt. Allow cookies to stand on sheets for 5 minutes, then transfer to baking racks to cool.
